
- Attach vertical rib blade supports (items #11 and #12) to the rear angle blade support (item #1) as shown. Use M10 carriage screws (item #4) and fasten with M10 locknut (item #5). (See illustration 1-1). *Note, do not fully tighten at this time.*
- Attach the assembled support to the moldboard blade (item #2) at the upper locations using fender washers (item #9) and M10 button cap screws (item #8) as shown. Fasten using M10 locknuts (item #5). *Note, do not fully tighten at this time.*



- Place the blade assembly on its back and attach the wear bar (item #3) to the blade and support assembly using the M8 carriage bolts (item #10) as shown. Fasten using M8 locknuts (item #7). (See illustration 1-3). Note, start with the middle wear bar hole first. The middle hole in the plastic moldboard is smaller to help index/center the blade.
- 4. Torque M8 fasteners to specification.

5. Torque the lower vertical support rib fasteners (items #4 and #5) to specification below.




6. Torque the lower vertical support rib fasteners (items #8 and #5) to specification below.




- Attached skid brackets (item #13) to each end of the rear angle support (item #1) using M8 carriage screws (item #6) as shown. Fasten using M8 locknuts (item #7). (See illustration 1-4).
- 8. Torque to M8 specification.



9. Assemble and install skid components (items #14, #15 and #16) as shown. Fasten using quick pins (items #17). (See illustration 1-5). Note, initial setting of skid height depends on the terrain. Set the skids even with the wear bar cutting edge for level surfaces such as concrete or asphalt. For irregular surfaces, lower the skids to raise the wear bar cutting edge.


- Position the pivot lock handle (item #3) into the blade pivot frame (item #2). Lock the handle assembly into place as shown. (See illustration 1-1).
- 2. Attach the tension spring (item #11) into the holes in the lock handle assembly and pivot frame assembly as shown. Using a spring puller (or shoe string) to pull on the higher side allows for easy installation of spring. (See illustration 1-2). *Note, the shorter spring end hook fits into the frame first.*








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CONNECTION LATCH ASSEMBLY










LIFT BRACKET ASSEMBLY

- Position the lift bracket (item #9) onto the push frame (item #1) as shown. Fasten using M8 screws (item #23) with M8 locknuts (item #24). (See illustration 1-7).
- The lift bracket (item #9) can be installed with loop facing forward or rearward as shown. (See illustration 1-8). 
- 16. Note, frame installation may require mount plate specific to your vehicle. Certain vehicles come equipped from the factory with the plow mount already attached to the vehicle.
- 17. Lay the plow assembly on the ground in front of the vehicle. Make sure the lock pins (item #14) are removed to allow the connection latch (item #5) to swing freely. (See illustration 1-13).
- Slide the assembly towards the vehicle so that the plow frame attachment pockets slide onto the vehicle plow mounting bar.



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



PIVOTING BLADE ANGLE SIDE TO SIDE


- 1. To adjust the angle of the plow blade so it pushes to the side, lift the plow up with the lift mechanism to clear the ground. Pull the pivot lock handle towards the blade and swivel the plow to desired angle. Release the pivot lock handle and the plow will lock itself in place at a predetermined angle on either side. (See illustration 2-1).
- 2. Be sure to frequently check that the (5) fasteners of the gear lock assembly are always tight to ensure good system function. (See illustration 2-2).





5. The plow is designed to trip forward when it hits a solid object. When the pressure on the plow is released, it will return to its original position by itself. (See illustration 2-6).




PLOW TRIPPING FORCE ADJUSTMENT

6. The plow trip springs may be set stiffer by tightening the self-locking nuts located at the ends of the eye bolts. For less tension, loosen the nuts. (See illustration 2-7).




PLOW IMPACT SHEAR POINTS


7. In the event of a collision with an obstacle at a speed greater than that recommended for the system, the pivot lock handle (item #3) and/or pivot lock gear plate (item #4) will break to minimize the force of impact in the frame. If the pivot lock handle and/or pivot lock gear plate is broken, inspect the plow system for broken parts. If any part is damaged, the impact velocity was greater than what the system is designed to support. You must then buy a replacement part from your dealer and/ or Kolpin customer care. (See illustration 2-8).



VEHICLE GROUND HEIGHT ADJUSTMENT

- 8. The plow frame has built-in ground height adjustment tabs for the connection latch assembly. For vehicles that have larger tires or higher ground clearances, the connection latch can be adjusted into the middle position as shown. Adjusting the connection latch will help keep the plow level for higher ground clearances, example 28" - 29" tire sizes. (See illustration 2-9). Note, refer to installation step 6 for details. The side brackets will be installed into the middle position.
- 9. For extra tall vehicles, example 30" or larger tire sizes, adjust the connection latch assembly into the highest position. (See illustration 2-10). Note, refer to installation step 6 for details. The side brackets will be installed into the tallest position.


- Remove the lift point bracket (bracket and three screws & locknuts from the 35-0070 Plow Frame as shown. Keep the as these will be reinstalled onto the 35-0350 extension frame (item #3). (See illustration 1-1).
- Remove the Connection Latch assembly (latch tube, two side plates, two M10 hex flange screws & washers, four M10 carriage screws & locknuts) from the 35-0070 Plow Frame as shown. Keep the items as these will be reinstalled onto the rear of 35-0350 extension frame (item #3). (See illustration 1-2). Note, keep the cotter pin and safety wire lock pins installed with the Connection Latch assembly.





Once installed, the power angle kit will remain on the High Rise push frame and includes a wire disconnect terminal. 




ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS:

INSTALLATION PREP:

 Remove the plastic cap from the push frame. Remove the spring and the screw securing the angling arm as shown. Using a rope or a spring puller to pull on the higher side allows for easy removal of spring. (See illustration 1-1).










POWER ANGLE INSTALLATION ONTO PUSH FRAME ASSEMBLY:


 Position the power angle motor frame assembly onto the push frame as shown. The hole (see illustration 2.2) in the push frame pivot assembly serves as bottom alignment guide for the gear assembly. Insert the five bolts, item #7, thru the power angle frame holes and push frame holes. Fasten the five flanged M8 nylon nuts, item # 11, onto bolts. Tighten to specification. (See illustration 2-1).








 Note, for the hard-to-reach nuts, use a 13mm wrench to hold the nuts while tightening. (See illustration 2-3).



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
POWER ANGLE INSTALLATION ONTO PUSH FRAME ASSEMBLY (continued):

- Connect the wiring (item #21) to the motor. Plug the white wire and black wire to the motor connectors as shown. Use the holes found on the left side of the gear housing to safely route the wiring using the included cable ties. (See illustration 2-4).
- 4. Then connect the wire harness (item #23) to the vehicle battery or power terminal block. The fused ring terminal wire lead connects to 12 VDC positive connection. The black ring terminal wire connects to the vehicle ground connection or negative battery terminal. *Note, see the wiring diagram and switch installations on following pages.*
- Install the new plastic cap (item #25) over the angling kit as shown. Be careful not to damage the wiring during installation. Begin by hooking the front of the cap to the front of the unit, then tilt the rear down until it clips. (See illustration 2-5).
- 6. Once cap is installed, secure using self -tapping screws (item #30) as shown. Tighten the screws until snug. (See illustration 2-6). *Note, older gen plow frames may not have pre-drilled holes for self-tapping screws. Use the plastic cap as pattern to mark hole location and drill using 1/8" drill bit (3.2mm).*



SWITCH INSTALLATION ONTO ATV VEHICLE:

- Install the bar clamps (item #16), straight section bracket (item #17) and switch bracket (item #18) onto the handlebar using screws (items #13 & #14) and nuts (item #8) as shown below. (See illustration 3-1).
- 2. Route the wiring and connected switch thru the plastic cap (item #19), then continue routing it along the handlebar using included cable ties. *Note, make sure to route wires where it will not make contact with hot engine surfaces or will be pinched by body components or make contact with moving parts.*
- 3. Verify the orientation of the angling kit switch by operating the motor using the switch. This will determine the orientation of the switch in the housing. Using the left arrow, the blade should be rotating counterclockwise (the left side of the plow rotating toward the vehicle). Be careful of your surroundings when operating the plow angling kit.
- 4. Install the switch inside the plastic cover (item #19) in the correct orientation.
- 5. Clip the plastic cover to the switch bracket (item #18). *Note, if the angling kit is not turning the correct way, the switch will need to be rotated 180 degrees in the housing. Using the left arrow, the blade should be rotating counterclockwise to the left (the left side of the blade rotating toward ATV).*




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SWITCH INSTALLATION ONTO UTV VEHICLE:


- To dash mount switch onto UTV, the switch bracket will need to be disassembled from factory ATV setup. Remove the switch from the switch bracket (item #18) and plastic switch cap (item #19) as shown below. For UTV installations, the ATV switch cover and bracket assemblies will not be needed. Save the wiring for next steps. (See illustration 4-1).
- Prepare location for dash panel mount. Using the panel hole cut out pattern below, mark or scribe the rectangle pattern into the dash. Using plastic cutting tool such as Dremel or drill bit, remove the material for the cut out. (See illustration 4-2 for cut out pattern dimensions. *Note illustration 4-2 is not to scale, please confirm measurements with ruler.*).
- 3. Route the wiring and connected switch thru the dash cut out, then continue routing it along the body or frame using included cable ties. *Note, make sure to route wires where it will not make contact with hot engine surfaces or will be pinched by body components or make contact with moving parts.*
- 4. Verify the orientation of the angling kit switch by operating the motor using the switch. This will determine the orientation of the switch in the housing. Using the left arrow, the blade should be rotating counterclockwise (the left side of the plow rotating toward the vehicle). Be careful of your surroundings when operating the plow angling kit.
- 5. Clip the switch into the dash hole cut-out. (See example images below). *Note, if the angling kit is not turning the correct way, the switch will need to be rotated 180 degrees in the housing. Using the left arrow, the blade should be rotating counterclockwise to the left (the left side of the blade rotating toward UTV).*






WIRE HARNESS **ROUTING ON VEHICLE:**

- 1. The vehicle wire harness (item #23) can be routed to the front grill area and secured using provided cable ties (item #1) as shown. To allow for plow raising and lowering movements, make sure to leave enough slack wire length from connector to cable tie. (See illustration 5-1).
- 2. The vehicle wire harness (item #23) includes a cover cap for the connector. The cap can be attached to the vehicle using provided cable ties (item #1) or badge trim adhesive (not included). When the plow is not attached to vehicle, the wire harness can be plugged into the cover cap as shown. (See illustration 5-2).





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USAGE INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Use the angling kit only when the plow is up, with no contact on the ground or against any obstacle.
- 2. Once the plow is not turning anymore (due to an obstacle or being locked in the furthest angle position on either side), release the switch.
- 3. Do not keep operating the angling kit when the plow is locked.
- 4. If there is ice build-up on gear system preventing power angle pivot operation, let plow system thaw in warm environment for 30 minutes.
- 5. Operate the power angle system per the duty cycle listed below.

DUTY CYCLE:

- Cool Time: 45 seconds
- Do not use over 65°F (18°F) or under –20°F (-28°C)

TROUBLESHOOTING:

- If the plow is not turning:
 - Check the fuse (located near positive terminal connection) for the Power Angle wiring harness
 - Check for dust or debris (ice, gravel, etc.) in the gears (located under plastic cap)
 - Check for any damage to the gear sets or plow push frame (related to hard impacts)
 - Check the connectors on the motor for a loose connection
 - Check the wiring for any damage
 - Check the battery voltage (continuous use with the vehicle not running will drain the battery)

- To remove dust or debris build-up on gears, use water to loosen material, then blow dry with pressurized clean air





CONTROLS AND FEATURES

Read this owner's manual before operating your winch. Familiarize yourself with the location and function of the controls and features. Save this manual for future reference. Some features may not exist on all models, but can be ordered as options, please contact technical services at **1-877-956-5746**.



- (1) **Motor:** 12V DC motor provides power to the planetary gear mechanism.
- (2) **Braking System:** Braking action is automatically applied to the winch drum when the winch motor is stopped and there is a load on the winch cable.
- (3) **Winch Drum:** The winch drum is the cylinder on which the wire rope is stored. It can feed or wind the rope depending on the remote winch switch signal.
- (4) Planetary Gear System: The reduction gears convert the winch motor power into extreme pulling forces. This system allows high torque while maintaining compact size and light weight.
- (5) Free Spooling Clutch: The clutch allows the operator to manually disengage "Out" the spooling drum from the gear train, free spool. Engaging the clutch "In" locks the winch into the gear system.
- (6) Mount Assembly: Flatbed mounting channel.
- (7) Roller Fairlead: When using the winch at an angle, the roller fairlead acts to guide the wire rope onto the drum and minimizes damage to the wire rope from abrasion on the winch mount or bumper.
- (8) **Rubber Winch Stop:** Increases life of cables, ropes and fairleads. Quiets hook rattling noise.

- (9) **Rope:** Galvanized steel aircraft cable or synthetic rope designed specifically for winch load capacities.
- (10) **Winch Connection Cables:** Used to connect the contactor to the winch motor.
- (11) **Battery Connection Cables:** Used to connect the battery to the contactor.
- (12) **Clevis Hook:** Provides a means for connecting the looped ends of cables to an anchor.
- (13) Strap: Used to assist cable feed.
- (14) Contactor/solenoid: Power from the vehicle battery flows through the weather sealed contactor/solenoid switch before being directed to the winch motor.
- (15) Rocker Switch: Rocker switch with handlebar mount for powering the rope in or out of your winch drum.
- (16) **Corded Remote Switch:** Corded remote switch allows the operator to stand clear during the winching process.
- (17) **Dash Mount Bracket:** Bracket allows the handlebar rocker switch to be installed onto a dash surface.

ASSEMBLY

The winch kit comes mostly assembled from the factory. Some pre-assembly of the kit is required for installation into vehicles.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN:

- Your Kolpin accessory is designed for a universe fit for most vehicles. •
- Please read and understand all instructions.
- Verify all parts and tools are accounted for. •
- To ensure a satisfactory installation, follow all steps cor-. rectly and in the sequence described.
- To facilitate installation, make sure that your vehicle is clean and free of debris.
- All directions referring to right and left are when the rider is sitting on the machine.

MOUNTING THE WINCH


- If using a winch mounting kit, refer to the kit's manual for specific installation instructions. See Kolpin.com for a full assortment of custom winch mounts for ATV/UTVs.
- Mount the winch to the mount plate (not included) as shown below. Rotate the lock knob to the free spool position and feed the winch cable through the rollers of the roller fairlead.
- Mount the roller fairlead plate and attach the hook clevis and nylon pull strap. Rotate the lock knob back to the lock position.

- Basic metric socket set



MOUNTING THE HANDLEBAR SWITCH

- Install the rocker switch to the handlebar using the hardware included in this kit as shown below.
- It is recommended that the switch be installed on the left handlebar. Exact position may vary depending on vehicle.
- Use a piece of electrical tape (not provided) around the handlebar to help prevent rotation of the switch bracket mount.
- Tighten the rocker switch in place. DO NOT overtighten or tighten/clamp over any hose, wiring or cables.
- Once the rocker switch is mounted, the wires can be routed to the contactor/solenoid location.
- Make sure the handlebars have full range of motion, vehicle switches/brakes/throttle can move freely, and then secure the rocker switch's cable with the supplied cable ties.
- Using the provided wire splice, splice the end of the red 20ga wire to a key controlled, fused, accessory circuit (power point) of the ATV/UTV. The wire should only have power when the key is in the "ON" position.



MOUNTING THE CONTACTOR/SOLENOID

- The contactor/solenoid is a primary safety feature in the winch system. It disconnects the winch from its power source when the vehicle is not in use. The contactor/solenoid must be correctly installed to work properly.
- Find a location for the contactor/solenoid. It is recommended that the contactor/solenoid be mounted close to the battery in a clean, dry location. The exact location of the contactor/solenoid will vary depending on the vehicle. Make sure the location chosen allows for sufficient clearance from all metal components such as frame tubes. DO NOT place tools or other items in a position that might come in contact with the contactor/solenoid posts.
- Drill mounting holes if required. Secure the contactor/solenoid using the provided hardware.
- Once a location is found for the contactor/solenoid, DO NOT install the unit until all wiring is completed (see wiring section). Pre-fit
 all wiring to confirm its long enough to reach the battery and the winch contact locations.

WARNING

NEVER short battery terminals with metal objects. Be aware terminals in contact with metal will cause a direct short, possibly causing contactor/ solenoid

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MOUNTING THE REMOTE SWITCH

(optional on some models)

- Determine the mounting location for the remote socket. Exact position may vary depending on vehicle. Drill three holes and install to vehicle dash panel or body panel.
- Route the wire harness to where the contactor/solenoid will be mounted. Secure the socket's cable with the supplied cable ties.
- Using the provided wire splice, splice the end of the red 20ga wire to a key controlled, accessory circuit (power-point) of the ATV/ UTV or use the provided 20ga wire eyelet terminal connector to connect to a vehicle terminal strip post. The wire should only have power when the key is in the "ON" position.
- NOTE: If installing both switches (handlebar rocker and corded remote), both 20ga red wires must be connected together with the provided plug connectors or spliced to a key-controlled accessory circuit of the ATV/UTV as described in the above step.



WIRING THE WINCH


ALWAYS make sure to splice into keyed accessory wire that has power when key is turned on. You may need to use a test light to locate a suitable wire.

- Install the wiring using the diagram on the next page.
- Slip terminal boots on yellow and blue cable ends. Connect the yellow and blue cables to the color-matched motor terminals on the winch. Tighten the terminal nuts on the motor. DO NOT overtighten. Seat boots over terminal. Route the other ends to the contactor/solenoid location.
- Connect the yellow and blue cables to the contactor/solenoid (yellow to yellow and blue to blue). DO NOT tighten nuts or seat boots at this time.
- Slip terminal boots on the ring terminal ends of the black and red cables. Connect the black and red cables to the contactor/ solenoid (red to red and black to black). DO NOT tighten nuts or seat boots at this time. Route red and black cables to battery. DO NOT connect cables to battery at this time.
- Mount the contactor to the location planned in the previous steps with provided hardware. Tighten the contactor/solenoid mounting fasteners. DO NOT overtighten.
- Adjust cables to facilitate orderly and straight routing of the cables from the contactor/solenoid. Avoid kinks or sharp bends in the cables. Avoid crossing cables over each other for at least the first 6" of cable starting from the contactor/solenoid post. Tighten the contactor/solenoid terminal nuts. DO NOT over tighten. Seat terminal boots over ring terminals and posts.
- Connect the rocker switch to the contactor/solenoid using the provided plug. Splice the end of the red wire on the rocker switch, to a vehicle accessory circuit controlled by ignition controlled power source (keyed). The wire should only have power when the key is in the "ON" position.
- Carefully inspect battery and winch electrical cable routing to ensure it is neat and tidy. Secure electrical cables and wiring harnesses with provided cable ties. Cable ties should be snug, but not cutting into wire insulation. Use electrical tape, pieces of rubber hose or electrical conduit to protect electrical cables and wire harnesses where needed to avoid electrical cable insulation wear or abrasion.
- Connect the red lead to the positive (+) terminal of the vehicle's 12 volt battery first. Connect the black lead to the negative (-) terminal of the vehicle's 12 volt battery second. Install protective boots as appropriate to protect connection. Tighten battery terminal fasteners as directed in the vehicle service manual to the proper torque specification.
- Check for proper drum rotation. Pull and turn the clutch knob to the "free spool" position. Pull out some cable from the drum, and then turn the clutch knob to the "locked spool" position to engage the gears. Press the cable out button on the rocker switch. If the drum is turning and releasing more cable, your connections are accurate. If the drum is turning and collecting more cable, then reverse the leads on the motor. Repeat and check rotation.
- With some applications, the motor terminal posts may need to be rotated to avoid interference with other components.



NEVER route electrical cables across any sharp edges, through and /or near moving parts, or near parts that may become hot.


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

ATV/UTV WINCH USER GUIDE

Before you begin using your winch, read and understand the guide. Please retain this guide for future reference.

These safety warnings and instructions apply if you choose to add an accessory winch to your vehicle.



ALWAYS follow all winch instructions and warnings in this manual. Improper winch use can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.


Your winch may have a cable made of either wire rope or specially designed synthetic rope. The term "winch cable" will be used for either unless noted otherwise.

WINCH SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- 1. Read all sections of this manual.
- 2. Never use alcohol or drugs before or while operating the winch.
- 3. Never allow children under 16 years of age to operate the winch.
- 4. Always wear eye protection and heavy gloves when operating the winch.
- 5. Always keep body, hair, clothing and jewelry clear of the winch cable, fairlead and hook when operating winch.
- 6. Never attempt to "jerk" a load attached to the winch with a moving vehicle. See the Shock Loading section on page 15.
- 7. Always keep the area around the vehicle, winch, winch cable and load clear of people (especially children) and distractions while operating the winch.
- 8. Always turn the vehicle ignition power OFF when it and the winch are not being used.
- 9. Always be sure that at least five full turns of winch cable are wrapped around the winch drum at all times. The friction provided by this wrapped cable allows the drum to pull on the winch cable and move the load.
- 10. Always apply your vehicle's park brake and/or park mechanism to hold the vehicle in place during winching. Use wheel chocks if needed.
- 11. Always align the vehicle and winch with the load directly in front of the vehicle as much as possible. Avoid winching with the winch cable at an angle to the winching vehicle's center line whenever possible.
- 12. If winching at an angle is unavoidable, follow these precautions:
 - A. Look at the winch drum occasionally. Never let the winch cable "stack" or accumulate at one end of the winch drum. Too much winch cable at one end of the winch drum can damage the winch and the winch cable.
 - B. If stacking occurs, stop winching. Follow step 15 on page 4 to feed and rewind the cable evenly before continuing the winch operation.
- 13. Never winch up or down at sharp angles. This can destabilize the winching vehicle and possibly cause it to move without warning.
- 14. Never attempt to winch loads that weigh more than the winch's rated capacity.
- 15. The winch motor may become hot during winch use. If you winch for more than 45 seconds, or if the winch stalls during operation, stop winching and permit the winch to cool down for 10 minutes before using it again.

WINCH SAFETY PRECAUTIONS (continued)

- 16. Never touch, push, pull or straddle the winch cable while winching a load.
- 17. Never let the winch cable run through your hands, even if wearing heavy gloves.
- 18. Never release the clutch on the winch when the winch cable is under load.
- 19. Never use the winch for lifting or transporting people.
- 20. Never use the winch to hoist or suspend a vertical load.
- 21. Never immerse or submerse your winch in water. Take your winch to your dealer for service if this occurs.
- 22. Always inspect your winch and winch cable before each use.
- 23. Never winch the hook fully into the winch. This can cause damage to winch components.
- 24. Unplug the remote control from the vehicle when the winch is not in use to prevent inadvertent activation and use by unauthorized persons.
- 25. Never grease or oil the winch cable. This will cause the winch cable to collect debris that will shorten the life of the cable.



WINCH OPERATION

Read the Winch Safety Precautions in the preceding pages before using your winch.

TIP: Consider practicing the operation and use or your winch before you actually need to use it in the field.



ALWAYS follow all winch instructions and warnings in this manual. Improper winch use can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.

Each winching situation is unique:

- Take your time to think through the winching you are about to do.
- Proceed slowly and deliberately.
- Never hurry or rush during winching.
- Always pay attention to your surroundings.
- You may need to change your winching strategy if it is not working.
- Always remember that your winch is very powerful.
- There are simply some situations that you and your winch will not be able to deal with. Do not be afraid to ask others to help when this happens.
- Always inspect the vehicle, winch, winch cable and winch controls for any signs of damage or parts in need of repair or replacement before each use. *Pay particular attention to the first three feet (one meter) of the winch cable if the winch is being used (or has been used) for lifting an accessory plow assembly.* Promptly replace any worn or damaged cable.
- 2. Never operate a winch or a vehicle in need of repair or service.
- Always apply your vehicle's parking brake and/or park mechanism to hold the vehicle in place during winching. Use wheel chocks if needed.
- 4. Always use the hook strap when handling the hook.



- Hook Strap
- A. Attach the hook itself onto the load or use a tow strap or chain to secure the load to the winch cable.

TIP: A "tow strap" is NOT intended to stretch. A "recovery strap" is designed to stretch.



NEVER use a recovery strap when winching due to the excessive energy that can be released if the winch cable breaks. This can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH. See the Shock Loading section on page 15.


ALWAYS replace the winch cable at the first sign of damage to prevent SEVERE INJURY or DEATH in the event of a failure. For your safety, always replace KOLPIN winch parts (including the cable) with KOLPIN replacement parts available at your authorized KOLPIN dealer or the KOLPIN website.

- E. Before operating the winch, be sure that the safety latch on the winch cable hook is fully seated when the load is attached.
- F. Never operate your winch with a damaged hook or latch. Always replace damaged parts before using the winch.
- 5. Never remove the hook strap from the hook.
- 6. Release the winch clutch and pull out the winch cable.
- 7. Pulling out as much cable as possible maximizes the winch's pulling capacity.

Always be sure that at least five full turns of winch cable are wrapped around the winch drum at all times. The friction provided by this wrapped cable allows the drum to pull on the winch cable and move the load.

- 8. Read and adhere to the following information for winch damping to ensure safe winch use.
 - A. In order to absorb energy that could be released by a winch cable failure, always place a "damper" on the winch cable. A damper can be a heavy jacket, tarp, or other soft, dense object. A damper can absorb much of the energy released if a winch cable breaks when winching. Even a tree limb can help as a damper if no other items are available to you.
 - B. Lay the damper on top of the mid-point of the winch cable length that is spooled out.
 - C. On a long pull, it may be necessary to stop winching so that the damper can be repositioned to the new mid-point of the winch cable. Always release the tension on the winch cable before repositioning the damper.
 - D. Avoid being directly in line with the winch cable whenever possible. Also, never permit others to stand near or in line with the winch cable during winch operation.
- 9. Never hook the winch cable back onto itself. This will damage the winch cable and may result in winch cable failure.
- 10. Never use straps, chains or other rigging items that are damaged or worn.
- 11. The ONLY time a winch-equipped vehicle should be moving when using the winch is when the vehicle itself is stuck. The winch equipped vehicle should NEVER be in motion to "shock" load the winch cable in an attempt to move a second stuck vehicle. See the *Shock Loading* section on page 14. For your safety, always follow these guidelines when winching a vehicle free:
 - A. Release the winch clutch and spool out the necessary length of winch cable.
 - B. Align the winch cable as close as possible to the winching vehicle's center line.
 - C. Attach the winch cable hook to the anchor point or the stuck vehicle's frame following instructions in this manual.
 - D. Re-engage the clutch on the winch.
 - E. Slowly winch in the slack in the winch cable.
 - F. Select the proper vehicle gear to propel the stuck vehicle in the direction of winching.
 - G. Shift to the lowest gear available on the stuck vehicle.
 - H. Slowly and carefully apply vehicle throttle and winch together to free the vehicle.
 - I. Stop winching as soon as the stuck vehicle is able to propel itself without the help of the winch.
 - J. Detach the winch cable hook.
 - K. Rewind the winch cable evenly back onto the winch drum following the instructions in this manual.

- 12. Never attempt to winch another stuck vehicle by attaching the winch cable to a suspension component, brush guard, bumper or cargo rack. Vehicle damage may result. Instead, attach the winch to a strong portion of the vehicle frame or hitch.
- 13. Extensive winching will run down the battery on the winching vehicle. Let the winching vehicle's engine run while operating the winch to prevent the battery from running low if winching for long periods.
- 14. The winch motor may become hot during winch use. If you winch for more than 45 seconds, or if the winch stalls during operation, stop winching and permit the winch to cool down for 10 minutes before using it again.
- 15. After winching is complete, especially if winching at an angle, it may be necessary to re-distribute the winch cable across the winch drum. You will need an assistant to perform this task.
 - A. Release the clutch on the winch.
 - B. Feed out the winch cable that is unevenly bunched up in one area.
 - C. Re-engage the winch clutch.
 - D. Have an assistant pull the winch cable tightly with about 100 lbs. (45 kg) of tension using the hook strap.
 - E. Slowly winch the cable in while your assistant moves the end of the winch cable back and forth horizontally to evenly distribute the winch cable on the drum.
 - F. Doing this reduces the chances of the winch cable "wedging" itself between lower layers of winch cable.


WINCH CABLE CARE

For your safety, always replace KOLPIN winch parts (including the cable) with KOLPIN replacement parts available at your authorized KOLPIN dealer or the KOLPIN website (Kolpin.com).

WARNING

NEVER use a worn or damaged cable. Use of a worn or damaged cable could lead to sudden failure and SEVERE INJURY.

- 1. Always inspect your winch before each use. Inspect for worn or loose parts including mounting hardware. Never use the winch if any part needs repair or replacement.
- 2. Always inspect your winch cable before each use. Inspect for worn or kinked winch cable.
 - A. A kinked winch cable made of wire rope is shown at right. Even after being "straightened out," this cable has already been permanently and severely damaged. Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.
 - B. A kinked winch cable made of wire rope that has been "straightened out" is shown at right. Even though it may look usable, the cable has been permanently and severely damaged. It can no longer transmit the load that it could prior to kinking. Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.
 - C. A winch cable made of synthetic rope should be inspected for signs of fraying. Replace the cable if fraying is observed (shown at right). Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.
 - D. Also replace the winch cable if there are fused or melted fibers. Such an area of the synthetic rope will be stiff and appear smooth or glazed. Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.





SHOCK LOADING

NEVER shock load a winch cable. Your winch cable is very strong but it is NOT designed for dynamic, or "shock" loading. Shock loading may tension a winch cable beyond its strength and cause the cable to break. The end of a broken winch cable under such high loading can cause SEVERE INJURY or DEATH to you and other bystanders.

Winch cables are designed to NOT absorb energy. This is true of both wire-rope and synthetic-rope winch cables.

1. Never attempt to "jerk" a load with the winch. For example, never take up slack in the winch cable by moving the winching vehicle in an attempt to move an object. This is a dangerous practice. It generates high winch cable loads that may exceed the strength of the cable. Even a slowly moving vehicle can create large shock loads in a winch cable.



NEVER use a broken winch cable. SEVERE INJURY or DEATH can result.

- 2. Never quickly turn the winch ON and OFF repeatedly ("jogging"). This puts extra load on the winch, winch cable, and generates excessive heat from the motor. This is a form of shock loading.
- 3. Never tow a vehicle or other object with your winch. Towing an object with a winch produces shock loading of the cable even when towing at slow speeds. Towing from a winch also positions the towing force high on the vehicle. This can cause instability of the vehicle and possibly lead to an accident.
- 4. Never use recovery straps with your winch. Recovery straps are designed to stretch and can store energy. This stored energy in the recovery strap is released if a winch cable fails making the event even more hazardous. Similarly, never use elastic "bungie" cords for winching.
- 5. Never use the winch to tie down a vehicle to a trailer or other transportation vehicle. This type of use also causes shock loading that can cause damage to the winch, winch cable, or vehicles used.
- 6. Your winch cable is designed and tested to withstand the loads produced by the winch motor when operated from a stationary vehicle. Always remember that the winch and winch cable are NOT designed for shock loading.

WINCH MAINTENANCE AND SERVICE SAFETY

ALWAYS follow all winch instructions and warnings in this manual. Improper or lack of winch maintenance and service could lead to SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.

- 1. Always inspect your winch before each use. Inspect for worn or kinked winch cable. Also inspect for worn or loose parts including mounting hardware.
- 2. Permit your winch motor to cool down prior to servicing your winch.
- 3. Never work on your winch without first disconnecting the battery connections to prevent accidental activation of the winch
- 4. For your safety, always replace KOLPIN winch parts (including the cable) with KOLPIN replacement parts available at your authorized KOLPIN dealer or the KOLPIN website (Kolpin.com).
- 5. Some winch models use wire rope as the winch cable. Other winches use a specially designed synthetic rope as the winch cable.
- Never replace a synthetic-rope winch cable with a consumer-grade polymer rope such as can be purchased in a hardware store. Although they may look similar, they are NOT alike. A polymer rope not designed for winch use will stretch and store excessive energy when winching.

WARNING

ALWAYS be aware that failure of a stretched rope under winching conditions will release all of the stored energy. This will increase the chances of SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.

LUBRICATION

All moving parts within the electric winch have been lubricated using high temperature grease at the factory. No internal lubrication is required. Never grease or oil the winch cable. This will cause the winch cable to collect debris that will shorten the life of the cable.

CABLE ASSEMBLY REPLACEMENT

It is recommended that only KOLPIN supplied parts be used.

- 1. Move the clutch to the "free-spool" position.
- 2. Extend cable assembly to its full length. Note how the existing cable is connected to the inside of the drum.
- 3. Remove old cable assembly and attach new one.
- 4. Retract cable assembly onto drum being careful not to allow kinking.






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Winch Dimensions - Front View

CONTROLS AND FEATURES

Read this owner's manual before operating your winch. Familiarize yourself with the location and function of the controls and features. Save this manual for future reference. Some features may not exist on all models, but can be ordered as options, please contact technical services at **1-877-956-5746**.



- (1) **Motor:** 12V DC motor provides power to the planetary gear mechanism.
- (2) **Braking System:** Braking action is automatically applied to the winch drum when the winch motor is stopped and there is a load on the winch cable.
- (3) **Winch Drum:** The winch drum is the cylinder on which the wire rope is stored. It can feed or wind the rope depending on the remote winch switch signal.
- (4) Planetary Gear System: The reduction gears convert the winch motor power into extreme pulling forces. This system allows high torque while maintaining compact size and light weight.
- (5) Free Spooling Clutch: The clutch allows the operator to manually disengage "Out" the spooling drum from the gear train, free spool. Engaging the clutch "In" locks the winch into the gear system.
- (6) Mount Assembly: Flatbed mounting channel.
- (7) Roller Fairlead: When using the winch at an angle, the roller fairlead acts to guide the wire rope onto the drum and minimizes damage to the wire rope from abrasion on the winch mount or bumper.
- (8) **Rubber Winch Stop:** Increases life of cables, ropes and fairleads. Quiets hook rattling noise.

- (9) **Rope:** Galvanized steel aircraft cable or synthetic rope designed specifically for winch load capacities.
- (10) **Winch Connection Cables:** Used to connect the contactor to the winch motor.
- (11) **Battery Connection Cables:** Used to connect the battery to the contactor.
- (12) **Clevis Hook:** Provides a means for connecting the looped ends of cables to an anchor.
- (13) Strap: Used to assist cable feed.
- (14) Contactor/solenoid: Power from the vehicle battery flows through the weather sealed contactor/solenoid switch before being directed to the winch motor.
- (15) Rocker Switch: Rocker switch with handlebar mount for powering the rope in or out of your winch drum.
- (16) **Corded Remote Switch:** Corded remote switch allows the operator to stand clear during the winching process.
- (17) **Dash Mount Bracket:** Bracket allows the handlebar rocker switch to be installed onto a dash surface.

ASSEMBLY

The winch kit comes mostly assembled from the factory. Some pre-assembly of the kit is required for installation into vehicles.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN:

- Your Kolpin accessory is designed for a universe fit for most vehicles. •
- Please read and understand all instructions.
- Verify all parts and tools are accounted for. •
- To ensure a satisfactory installation, follow all steps cor-. rectly and in the sequence described.
- To facilitate installation, make sure that your vehicle is clean and free of debris.
- All directions referring to right and left are when the rider is sitting on the machine.

MOUNTING THE WINCH


- If using a winch mounting kit, refer to the kit's manual for specific installation instructions. See Kolpin.com for a full assortment of custom winch mounts for ATV/UTVs.
- Mount the winch to the mount plate (not included) as shown below. Rotate the lock knob to the free spool position and feed the winch cable through the rollers of the roller fairlead.
- Mount the roller fairlead plate and attach the hook clevis and nylon pull strap. Rotate the lock knob back to the lock position.

- Basic metric wrench set
- Basic metric socket set
- Pliers
- Philips screwdriver



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MOUNTING THE HANDLEBAR SWITCH

- Install the rocker switch to the handlebar using the hardware included in this kit as shown below.
- It is recommended that the switch be installed on the left handlebar. Exact position may vary depending on vehicle.
- Use a piece of electrical tape (not provided) around the handlebar to help prevent rotation of the switch bracket mount.
- Tighten the rocker switch in place. DO NOT overtighten or tighten/clamp over any hose, wiring or cables.
- Once the rocker switch is mounted, the wires can be routed to the contactor/solenoid location.
- Make sure the handlebars have full range of motion, vehicle switches/brakes/throttle can move freely, and then secure the rocker switch's cable with the supplied cable ties.
- Using the provided wire splice, splice the end of the red 20ga wire to a key controlled, fused, accessory circuit (power point) of the ATV/UTV. The wire should only have power when the key is in the "ON" position.



MOUNTING THE CONTACTOR/SOLENOID

- The contactor/solenoid is a primary safety feature in the winch system. It disconnects the winch from its power source when the vehicle is not in use. The contactor/solenoid must be correctly installed to work properly.
- Find a location for the contactor/solenoid. It is recommended that the contactor/solenoid be mounted close to the battery in a clean, dry location. The exact location of the contactor/solenoid will vary depending on the vehicle. Make sure the location chosen allows for sufficient clearance from all metal components such as frame tubes. DO NOT place tools or other items in a position that might come in contact with the contactor/solenoid posts.
- Drill mounting holes if required. Secure the contactor/solenoid using the provided hardware.
- Once a location is found for the contactor/solenoid, DO NOT install the unit until all wiring is completed (see wiring section). Pre-fit
 all wiring to confirm its long enough to reach the battery and the winch contact locations.

WARNING

NEVER short battery terminals with metal objects. Be aware terminals in contact with metal will cause a direct short, possibly causing contactor/ solenoid

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MOUNTING THE REMOTE SWITCH

(optional on some models)

- Determine the mounting location for the remote socket. Exact position may vary depending on vehicle. Drill three holes and install to vehicle dash panel or body panel.
- Route the wire harness to where the contactor/solenoid will be mounted. Secure the socket's cable with the supplied cable ties.
- Using the provided wire splice, splice the end of the red 20ga wire to a key controlled, accessory circuit (power-point) of the ATV/ UTV or use the provided 20ga wire eyelet terminal connector to connect to a vehicle terminal strip post. The wire should only have power when the key is in the "ON" position.
- NOTE: If installing both switches (handlebar rocker and corded remote), both 20ga red wires must be connected together with the provided plug connectors or spliced to a key-controlled accessory circuit of the ATV/UTV as described in the above step.



WIRING THE WINCH


ALWAYS make sure to splice into keyed accessory wire that has power when key is turned on. You may need to use a test light to locate a suitable wire.

- Install the wiring using the diagram on the next page.
- Slip terminal boots on yellow and blue cable ends. Connect the yellow and blue cables to the color-matched motor terminals on the winch. Tighten the terminal nuts on the motor. DO NOT overtighten. Seat boots over terminal. Route the other ends to the contactor/solenoid location.
- Connect the yellow and blue cables to the contactor/solenoid (yellow to yellow and blue to blue). DO NOT tighten nuts or seat boots at this time.
- Slip terminal boots on the ring terminal ends of the black and red cables. Connect the black and red cables to the contactor/ solenoid (red to red and black to black). DO NOT tighten nuts or seat boots at this time. Route red and black cables to battery. DO NOT connect cables to battery at this time.
- Mount the contactor to the location planned in the previous steps with provided hardware. Tighten the contactor/solenoid mounting fasteners. DO NOT overtighten.
- Adjust cables to facilitate orderly and straight routing of the cables from the contactor/solenoid. Avoid kinks or sharp bends in the cables. Avoid crossing cables over each other for at least the first 6" of cable starting from the contactor/solenoid post. Tighten the contactor/solenoid terminal nuts. DO NOT over tighten. Seat terminal boots over ring terminals and posts.
- Connect the rocker switch to the contactor/solenoid using the provided plug. Splice the end of the red wire on the rocker switch, to a vehicle accessory circuit controlled by ignition controlled power source (keyed). The wire should only have power when the key is in the "ON" position.
- Carefully inspect battery and winch electrical cable routing to ensure it is neat and tidy. Secure electrical cables and wiring harnesses with provided cable ties. Cable ties should be snug, but not cutting into wire insulation. Use electrical tape, pieces of rubber hose or electrical conduit to protect electrical cables and wire harnesses where needed to avoid electrical cable insulation wear or abrasion.
- Connect the red lead to the positive (+) terminal of the vehicle's 12 volt battery first. Connect the black lead to the negative (-) terminal of the vehicle's 12 volt battery second. Install protective boots as appropriate to protect connection. Tighten battery terminal fasteners as directed in the vehicle service manual to the proper torque specification.
- Check for proper drum rotation. Pull and turn the clutch knob to the "free spool" position. Pull out some cable from the drum, and then turn the clutch knob to the "locked spool" position to engage the gears. Press the cable out button on the rocker switch. If the drum is turning and releasing more cable, your connections are accurate. If the drum is turning and collecting more cable, then reverse the leads on the motor. Repeat and check rotation.
- With some applications, the motor terminal posts may need to be rotated to avoid interference with other components.



NEVER route electrical cables across any sharp edges, through and /or near moving parts, or near parts that may become hot.


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

Before you begin using your winch, read and understand the guide. Please retain this guide for future reference.

These safety warnings and instructions apply if you choose to add an accessory winch to your vehicle.



ALWAYS follow all winch instructions and warnings in this manual. Improper winch use can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.


Your winch may have a cable made of either wire rope or specially designed synthetic rope. The term "winch cable" will be used for either unless noted otherwise.

WINCH SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- 1. Read all sections of this manual.
- 2. Never use alcohol or drugs before or while operating the winch.
- 3. Never allow children under 16 years of age to operate the winch.
- 4. Always wear eye protection and heavy gloves when operating the winch.
- 5. Always keep body, hair, clothing and jewelry clear of the winch cable, fairlead and hook when operating winch.
- 6. Never attempt to "jerk" a load attached to the winch with a moving vehicle. See the Shock Loading section on page 15.
- 7. Always keep the area around the vehicle, winch, winch cable and load clear of people (especially children) and distractions while operating the winch.
- 8. Always turn the vehicle ignition power OFF when it and the winch are not being used.
- 9. Always be sure that at least five full turns of winch cable are wrapped around the winch drum at all times. The friction provided by this wrapped cable allows the drum to pull on the winch cable and move the load.
- 10. Always apply your vehicle's park brake and/or park mechanism to hold the vehicle in place during winching. Use wheel chocks if needed.
- 11. Always align the vehicle and winch with the load directly in front of the vehicle as much as possible. Avoid winching with the winch cable at an angle to the winching vehicle's center line whenever possible.
- 12. If winching at an angle is unavoidable, follow these precautions:
 - A. Look at the winch drum occasionally. Never let the winch cable "stack" or accumulate at one end of the winch drum. Too much winch cable at one end of the winch drum can damage the winch and the winch cable.
 - B. If stacking occurs, stop winching. Follow step 15 on page 4 to feed and rewind the cable evenly before continuing the winch operation.
- 13. Never winch up or down at sharp angles. This can destabilize the winching vehicle and possibly cause it to move without warning.
- 14. Never attempt to winch loads that weigh more than the winch's rated capacity.
- 15. The winch motor may become hot during winch use. If you winch for more than 45 seconds, or if the winch stalls during operation, stop winching and permit the winch to cool down for 10 minutes before using it again.

WINCH SAFETY PRECAUTIONS (continued)

- 16. Never touch, push, pull or straddle the winch cable while winching a load.
- 17. Never let the winch cable run through your hands, even if wearing heavy gloves.
- 18. Never release the clutch on the winch when the winch cable is under load.
- 19. Never use the winch for lifting or transporting people.
- 20. Never use the winch to hoist or suspend a vertical load.
- 21. Never immerse or submerse your winch in water. Take your winch to your dealer for service if this occurs.
- 22. Always inspect your winch and winch cable before each use.
- 23. Never winch the hook fully into the winch. This can cause damage to winch components.
- 24. Unplug the remote control from the vehicle when the winch is not in use to prevent inadvertent activation and use by unauthorized persons.
- 25. Never grease or oil the winch cable. This will cause the winch cable to collect debris that will shorten the life of the cable.



WINCH OPERATION

Read the Winch Safety Precautions in the preceding pages before using your winch.

TIP: Consider practicing the operation and use or your winch before you actually need to use it in the field.



ALWAYS follow all winch instructions and warnings in this manual. Improper winch use can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.

Each winching situation is unique:

- Take your time to think through the winching you are about to do.
- Proceed slowly and deliberately.
- Never hurry or rush during winching.
- Always pay attention to your surroundings.
- You may need to change your winching strategy if it is not working.
- Always remember that your winch is very powerful.
- There are simply some situations that you and your winch will not be able to deal with. Do not be afraid to ask others to help when this happens.
- Always inspect the vehicle, winch, winch cable and winch controls for any signs of damage or parts in need of repair or replacement before each use. *Pay particular attention to the first three feet (one meter) of the winch cable if the winch is being used (or has been used) for lifting an accessory plow assembly.* Promptly replace any worn or damaged cable.
- 2. Never operate a winch or a vehicle in need of repair or service.
- Always apply your vehicle's parking brake and/or park mechanism to hold the vehicle in place during winching. Use wheel chocks if needed.
- 4. Always use the hook strap when handling the hook.




- Hook Strap
- A. Attach the hook itself onto the load or use a tow strap or chain to secure the load to the winch cable.

TIP: A "tow strap" is NOT intended to stretch. A "recovery strap" is designed to stretch.



NEVER use a recovery strap when winching due to the excessive energy that can be released if the winch cable breaks. This can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH. See the Shock Loading section on page 15.


ALWAYS replace the winch cable at the first sign of damage to prevent SEVERE INJURY or DEATH in the event of a failure. For your safety, always replace KOLPIN winch parts (including the cable) with KOLPIN replacement parts available at your authorized KOLPIN dealer or the KOLPIN website.

- E. Before operating the winch, be sure that the safety latch on the winch cable hook is fully seated when the load is attached.
- F. Never operate your winch with a damaged hook or latch. Always replace damaged parts before using the winch.
- 5. Never remove the hook strap from the hook.
- 6. Release the winch clutch and pull out the winch cable.
- 7. Pulling out as much cable as possible maximizes the winch's pulling capacity.

Always be sure that at least five full turns of winch cable are wrapped around the winch drum at all times. The friction provided by this wrapped cable allows the drum to pull on the winch cable and move the load.

- 8. Read and adhere to the following information for winch damping to ensure safe winch use.
 - A. In order to absorb energy that could be released by a winch cable failure, always place a "damper" on the winch cable. A damper can be a heavy jacket, tarp, or other soft, dense object. A damper can absorb much of the energy released if a winch cable breaks when winching. Even a tree limb can help as a damper if no other items are available to you.
 - B. Lay the damper on top of the mid-point of the winch cable length that is spooled out.
 - C. On a long pull, it may be necessary to stop winching so that the damper can be repositioned to the new mid-point of the winch cable. Always release the tension on the winch cable before repositioning the damper.
 - D. Avoid being directly in line with the winch cable whenever possible. Also, never permit others to stand near or in line with the winch cable during winch operation.
- 9. Never hook the winch cable back onto itself. This will damage the winch cable and may result in winch cable failure.
- 10. Never use straps, chains or other rigging items that are damaged or worn.
- 11. The ONLY time a winch-equipped vehicle should be moving when using the winch is when the vehicle itself is stuck. The winch equipped vehicle should NEVER be in motion to "shock" load the winch cable in an attempt to move a second stuck vehicle. See the *Shock Loading* section on page 14. For your safety, always follow these guidelines when winching a vehicle free:
 - A. Release the winch clutch and spool out the necessary length of winch cable.
 - B. Align the winch cable as close as possible to the winching vehicle's center line.
 - C. Attach the winch cable hook to the anchor point or the stuck vehicle's frame following instructions in this manual.
 - D. Re-engage the clutch on the winch.
 - E. Slowly winch in the slack in the winch cable.
 - F. Select the proper vehicle gear to propel the stuck vehicle in the direction of winching.
 - G. Shift to the lowest gear available on the stuck vehicle.
 - H. Slowly and carefully apply vehicle throttle and winch together to free the vehicle.
 - I. Stop winching as soon as the stuck vehicle is able to propel itself without the help of the winch.
 - J. Detach the winch cable hook.
 - K. Rewind the winch cable evenly back onto the winch drum following the instructions in this manual.

- 12. Never attempt to winch another stuck vehicle by attaching the winch cable to a suspension component, brush guard, bumper or cargo rack. Vehicle damage may result. Instead, attach the winch to a strong portion of the vehicle frame or hitch.
- 13. Extensive winching will run down the battery on the winching vehicle. Let the winching vehicle's engine run while operating the winch to prevent the battery from running low if winching for long periods.
- 14. The winch motor may become hot during winch use. If you winch for more than 45 seconds, or if the winch stalls during operation, stop winching and permit the winch to cool down for 10 minutes before using it again.
- 15. After winching is complete, especially if winching at an angle, it may be necessary to re-distribute the winch cable across the winch drum. You will need an assistant to perform this task.
 - A. Release the clutch on the winch.
 - B. Feed out the winch cable that is unevenly bunched up in one area.
 - C. Re-engage the winch clutch.
 - D. Have an assistant pull the winch cable tightly with about 100 lbs. (45 kg) of tension using the hook strap.
 - E. Slowly winch the cable in while your assistant moves the end of the winch cable back and forth horizontally to evenly distribute the winch cable on the drum.
 - F. Doing this reduces the chances of the winch cable "wedging" itself between lower layers of winch cable.


WINCH CABLE CARE

For your safety, always replace KOLPIN winch parts (including the cable) with KOLPIN replacement parts available at your authorized KOLPIN dealer or the KOLPIN website (Kolpin.com).

WARNING

NEVER use a worn or damaged cable. Use of a worn or damaged cable could lead to sudden failure and SEVERE INJURY.

- 1. Always inspect your winch before each use. Inspect for worn or loose parts including mounting hardware. Never use the winch if any part needs repair or replacement.
- 2. Always inspect your winch cable before each use. Inspect for worn or kinked winch cable.
 - A. A kinked winch cable made of wire rope is shown at right. Even after being "straightened out," this cable has already been permanently and severely damaged. Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.
 - B. A kinked winch cable made of wire rope that has been "straightened out" is shown at right. Even though it may look usable, the cable has been permanently and severely damaged. It can no longer transmit the load that it could prior to kinking. Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.
 - C. A winch cable made of synthetic rope should be inspected for signs of fraying. Replace the cable if fraying is observed (shown at right). Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.
 - D. Also replace the winch cable if there are fused or melted fibers. Such an area of the synthetic rope will be stiff and appear smooth or glazed. Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.





SHOCK LOADING

NEVER shock load a winch cable. Your winch cable is very strong but it is NOT designed for dynamic, or "shock" loading. Shock loading may tension a winch cable beyond its strength and cause the cable to break. The end of a broken winch cable under such high loading can cause SEVERE INJURY or DEATH to you and other bystanders.

Winch cables are designed to NOT absorb energy. This is true of both wire-rope and synthetic-rope winch cables.

1. Never attempt to "jerk" a load with the winch. For example, never take up slack in the winch cable by moving the winching vehicle in an attempt to move an object. This is a dangerous practice. It generates high winch cable loads that may exceed the strength of the cable. Even a slowly moving vehicle can create large shock loads in a winch cable.



NEVER use a broken winch cable. SEVERE INJURY or DEATH can result.

- 2. Never quickly turn the winch ON and OFF repeatedly ("jogging"). This puts extra load on the winch, winch cable, and generates excessive heat from the motor. This is a form of shock loading.
- 3. Never tow a vehicle or other object with your winch. Towing an object with a winch produces shock loading of the cable even when towing at slow speeds. Towing from a winch also positions the towing force high on the vehicle. This can cause instability of the vehicle and possibly lead to an accident.
- 4. Never use recovery straps with your winch. Recovery straps are designed to stretch and can store energy. This stored energy in the recovery strap is released if a winch cable fails making the event even more hazardous. Similarly, never use elastic "bungie" cords for winching.
- 5. Never use the winch to tie down a vehicle to a trailer or other transportation vehicle. This type of use also causes shock loading that can cause damage to the winch, winch cable, or vehicles used.
- 6. Your winch cable is designed and tested to withstand the loads produced by the winch motor when operated from a stationary vehicle. Always remember that the winch and winch cable are NOT designed for shock loading.

WINCH MAINTENANCE AND SERVICE SAFETY

ALWAYS follow all winch instructions and warnings in this manual. Improper or lack of winch maintenance and service could lead to SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.

- 1. Always inspect your winch before each use. Inspect for worn or kinked winch cable. Also inspect for worn or loose parts including mounting hardware.
- 2. Permit your winch motor to cool down prior to servicing your winch.
- 3. Never work on your winch without first disconnecting the battery connections to prevent accidental activation of the winch
- 4. For your safety, always replace KOLPIN winch parts (including the cable) with KOLPIN replacement parts available at your authorized KOLPIN dealer or the KOLPIN website (Kolpin.com).
- 5. Some winch models use wire rope as the winch cable. Other winches use a specially designed synthetic rope as the winch cable.
- Never replace a synthetic-rope winch cable with a consumer-grade polymer rope such as can be purchased in a hardware store. Although they may look similar, they are NOT alike. A polymer rope not designed for winch use will stretch and store excessive energy when winching.

WARNING

ALWAYS be aware that failure of a stretched rope under winching conditions will release all of the stored energy. This will increase the chances of SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.

LUBRICATION

All moving parts within the electric winch have been lubricated using high temperature grease at the factory. No internal lubrication is required. Never grease or oil the winch cable. This will cause the winch cable to collect debris that will shorten the life of the cable.

CABLE ASSEMBLY REPLACEMENT

It is recommended that only KOLPIN supplied parts be used.

- 1. Move the clutch to the "free-spool" position.
- 2. Extend cable assembly to its full length. Note how the existing cable is connected to the inside of the drum.
- 3. Remove old cable assembly and attach new one.
- 4. Retract cable assembly onto drum being careful not to allow kinking.

CONTROLS AND FEATURES

Read this owner's manual before operating your winch. Familiarize yourself with the location and function of the controls and features. Save this manual for future reference. Some features may not exist on all models, but can be ordered as options, please contact technical services at **1-877-956-5746**.



- (1) **Motor:** 12V DC motor provides power to the planetary gear mechanism.
- (2) **Braking System:** Braking action is automatically applied to the winch drum when the winch motor is stopped and there is a load on the winch cable.
- (3) **Winch Drum:** The winch drum is the cylinder on which the wire rope is stored. It can feed or wind the rope depending on the remote winch switch signal.
- (4) Planetary Gear System: The reduction gears convert the winch motor power into extreme pulling forces. This system allows high torque while maintaining compact size and light weight.
- (5) Free Spooling Clutch: The clutch allows the operator to manually disengage "Out" the spooling drum from the gear train, free spool. Engaging the clutch "In" locks the winch into the gear system.
- (6) Mount Assembly: Flatbed mounting channel.
- (7) Roller Fairlead: When using the winch at an angle, the roller fairlead acts to guide the wire rope onto the drum and minimizes damage to the wire rope from abrasion on the winch mount or bumper.
- (8) **Rubber Winch Stop:** Increases life of cables, ropes and fairleads. Quiets hook rattling noise.

- (9) **Rope:** Galvanized steel aircraft cable or synthetic rope designed specifically for winch load capacities.
- (10) **Winch Connection Cables:** Used to connect the contactor to the winch motor.
- (11) **Battery Connection Cables:** Used to connect the battery to the contactor.
- (12) **Clevis Hook:** Provides a means for connecting the looped ends of cables to an anchor.
- (13) Strap: Used to assist cable feed.
- (14) Contactor/solenoid: Power from the vehicle battery flows through the weather sealed contactor/solenoid switch before being directed to the winch motor.
- (15) Rocker Switch: Rocker switch with handlebar mount for powering the rope in or out of your winch drum.
- (16) **Corded Remote Switch:** Corded remote switch allows the operator to stand clear during the winching process.
- (17) **Dash Mount Bracket:** Bracket allows the handlebar rocker switch to be installed onto a dash surface.

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ASSEMBLY

The winch kit comes mostly assembled from the factory. Some pre-assembly of the kit is required for installation into vehicles.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN:

- Your Kolpin accessory is designed for a universe fit for most vehicles. .
- Please read and understand all instructions.
- Verify all parts and tools are accounted for. •
- To ensure a satisfactory installation, follow all steps cor-. rectly and in the sequence described.
- To facilitate installation, make sure that your vehicle is clean and free of debris.
- All directions referring to right and left are when the rider is sitting on the machine.

MOUNTING THE WINCH


- If using a winch mounting kit, refer to the kit's manual for specific installation instructions. See Kolpin.com for a full assortment of custom winch mounts for ATV/UTVs.
- Mount the winch to the mount plate (not included) as shown below. Rotate the lock knob to the free spool position and feed the winch cable through the rollers of the roller fairlead.

TOOLS REQUIRED:

- Basic metric wrench set
- Basic metric socket set


WARNING

ALWAYS use supplied hook strap.



MOUNTING THE HANDLEBAR SWITCH

- Install the rocker switch to the handlebar using the hardware included in this kit as shown below.
- It is recommended that the switch be installed on the left handlebar. Exact position may vary depending on vehicle.
- Use a piece of electrical tape (not provided) around the handlebar to help prevent rotation of the switch bracket mount.
- Tighten the rocker switch in place. DO NOT overtighten or tighten/clamp over any hose, wiring or cables.
- Once the rocker switch is mounted, the wires can be routed to the contactor/solenoid location.
- Make sure the handlebars have full range of motion, vehicle switches/brakes/throttle can move freely, and then secure the rocker switch's cable with the supplied cable ties.
- Using the provided wire splice, splice the end of the red 20ga wire to a key controlled, fused, accessory circuit (power point) of the ATV/UTV. The wire should only have power when the key is in the "ON" position.



MOUNTING THE CONTACTOR/SOLENOID

- The contactor/solenoid is a primary safety feature in the winch system. It disconnects the winch from its power source when the vehicle is not in use. The contactor/solenoid must be correctly installed to work properly.
- Find a location for the contactor/solenoid. It is recommended that the contactor/solenoid be mounted close to the battery in a clean, dry location. The exact location of the contactor/solenoid will vary depending on the vehicle. Make sure the location chosen allows for sufficient clearance from all metal components such as frame tubes. DO NOT place tools or other items in a position that might come in contact with the contactor/solenoid posts.
- Drill mounting holes if required. Secure the contactor/solenoid using the provided hardware.
- Once a location is found for the contactor/solenoid, DO NOT install the unit until all wiring is completed (see wiring section). Pre-fit
 all wiring to confirm its long enough to reach the battery and the winch contact locations.

WARNING

NEVER short battery terminals with metal objects. Be aware terminals in contact with metal will cause a direct short, possibly causing contactor/ solenoid

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MOUNTING THE REMOTE SWITCH

(optional on some models)

- Determine the mounting location for the remote socket. Exact position may vary depending on vehicle. Drill three holes and install to vehicle dash panel or body panel.
- Route the wire harness to where the contactor/solenoid will be mounted. Secure the socket's cable with the supplied cable ties.
- Using the provided wire splice, splice the end of the red 20ga wire to a key controlled, accessory circuit (power-point) of the ATV/ UTV or use the provided 20ga wire eyelet terminal connector to connect to a vehicle terminal strip post. The wire should only have power when the key is in the "ON" position.
- NOTE: If installing both switches (handlebar rocker and corded remote), both 20ga red wires must be connected together with the provided plug connectors or spliced to a key-controlled accessory circuit of the ATV/UTV as described in the above step.



WIRING THE WINCH


ALWAYS make sure to splice into keyed accessory wire that has power when key is turned on. You may need to use a test light to locate a suitable wire.

- Install the wiring using the diagram on the next page.
- Slip terminal boots on yellow and blue cable ends. Connect the yellow and blue cables to the color-matched motor terminals on the winch. Tighten the terminal nuts on the motor. DO NOT overtighten. Seat boots over terminal. Route the other ends to the contactor/solenoid location.
- Connect the yellow and blue cables to the contactor/solenoid (yellow to yellow and blue to blue). DO NOT tighten nuts or seat boots at this time.
- Slip terminal boots on the ring terminal ends of the black and red cables. Connect the black and red cables to the contactor/ solenoid (red to red and black to black). DO NOT tighten nuts or seat boots at this time. Route red and black cables to battery. DO NOT connect cables to battery at this time.
- Mount the contactor to the location planned in the previous steps with provided hardware. Tighten the contactor/solenoid mounting fasteners. DO NOT overtighten.
- Adjust cables to facilitate orderly and straight routing of the cables from the contactor/solenoid. Avoid kinks or sharp bends in the cables. Avoid crossing cables over each other for at least the first 6" of cable starting from the contactor/solenoid post. Tighten the contactor/solenoid terminal nuts. DO NOT over tighten. Seat terminal boots over ring terminals and posts.
- Connect the rocker switch to the contactor/solenoid using the provided plug. Splice the end of the red wire on the rocker switch, to a vehicle accessory circuit controlled by ignition controlled power source (keyed). The wire should only have power when the key is in the "ON" position.
- Carefully inspect battery and winch electrical cable routing to ensure it is neat and tidy. Secure electrical cables and wiring harnesses with provided cable ties. Cable ties should be snug, but not cutting into wire insulation. Use electrical tape, pieces of rubber hose or electrical conduit to protect electrical cables and wire harnesses where needed to avoid electrical cable insulation wear or abrasion.
- Connect the red lead to the positive (+) terminal of the vehicle's 12 volt battery first. Connect the black lead to the negative (-) terminal of the vehicle's 12 volt battery second. Install protective boots as appropriate to protect connection. Tighten battery terminal fasteners as directed in the vehicle service manual to the proper torque specification.
- Check for proper drum rotation. Pull and turn the clutch knob to the "free spool" position. Pull out some cable from the drum, and then turn the clutch knob to the "locked spool" position to engage the gears. Press the cable out button on the rocker switch. If the drum is turning and releasing more cable, your connections are accurate. If the drum is turning and collecting more cable, then reverse the leads on the motor. Repeat and check rotation.
- With some applications, the motor terminal posts may need to be rotated to avoid interference with other components.



NEVER route electrical cables across any sharp edges, through and /or near moving parts, or near parts that may become hot.

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



ATV/UTV WINCH USER GUIDE

Before you begin using your winch, read and understand the guide. Please retain this guide for future reference.

These safety warnings and instructions apply if you choose to add an accessory winch to your vehicle.



ALWAYS follow all winch instructions and warnings in this manual. Improper winch use can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.


Your winch may have a cable made of either wire rope or specially designed synthetic rope. The term "winch cable" will be used for either unless noted otherwise.

WINCH SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- 1. Read all sections of this manual.
- 2. Never use alcohol or drugs before or while operating the winch.
- 3. Never allow children under 16 years of age to operate the winch.
- 4. Always wear eye protection and heavy gloves when operating the winch.
- 5. Always keep body, hair, clothing and jewelry clear of the winch cable, fairlead and hook when operating winch.
- 6. Never attempt to "jerk" a load attached to the winch with a moving vehicle. See the Shock Loading section on page 15.
- 7. Always keep the area around the vehicle, winch, winch cable and load clear of people (especially children) and distractions while operating the winch.
- 8. Always turn the vehicle ignition power OFF when it and the winch are not being used.
- 9. Always be sure that at least five full turns of winch cable are wrapped around the winch drum at all times. The friction provided by this wrapped cable allows the drum to pull on the winch cable and move the load.
- 10. Always apply your vehicle's park brake and/or park mechanism to hold the vehicle in place during winching. Use wheel chocks if needed.
- 11. Always align the vehicle and winch with the load directly in front of the vehicle as much as possible. Avoid winching with the winch cable at an angle to the winching vehicle's center line whenever possible.
- 12. If winching at an angle is unavoidable, follow these precautions:
 - A. Look at the winch drum occasionally. Never let the winch cable "stack" or accumulate at one end of the winch drum. Too much winch cable at one end of the winch drum can damage the winch and the winch cable.
 - B. If stacking occurs, stop winching. Follow step 15 on page 4 to feed and rewind the cable evenly before continuing the winch operation.
- 13. Never winch up or down at sharp angles. This can destabilize the winching vehicle and possibly cause it to move without warning.
- 14. Never attempt to winch loads that weigh more than the winch's rated capacity.
- 15. The winch motor may become hot during winch use. If you winch for more than 45 seconds, or if the winch stalls during operation, stop winching and permit the winch to cool down for 10 minutes before using it again.

WINCH SAFETY PRECAUTIONS (continued)

- 16. Never touch, push, pull or straddle the winch cable while winching a load.
- 17. Never let the winch cable run through your hands, even if wearing heavy gloves.
- 18. Never release the clutch on the winch when the winch cable is under load.
- 19. Never use the winch for lifting or transporting people.
- 20. Never use the winch to hoist or suspend a vertical load.
- 21. Never immerse or submerse your winch in water. Take your winch to your dealer for service if this occurs.
- 22. Always inspect your winch and winch cable before each use.
- 23. Never winch the hook fully into the winch. This can cause damage to winch components.
- 24. Unplug the remote control from the vehicle when the winch is not in use to prevent inadvertent activation and use by unauthorized persons.
- 25. Never grease or oil the winch cable. This will cause the winch cable to collect debris that will shorten the life of the cable.



WINCH OPERATION

Read the Winch Safety Precautions in the preceding pages before using your winch.

TIP: Consider practicing the operation and use or your winch before you actually need to use it in the field.



ALWAYS follow all winch instructions and warnings in this manual. Improper winch use can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.

Each winching situation is unique:

- Take your time to think through the winching you are about to do.
- Proceed slowly and deliberately.
- Never hurry or rush during winching.
- Always pay attention to your surroundings.
- You may need to change your winching strategy if it is not working.
- Always remember that your winch is very powerful.
- There are simply some situations that you and your winch will not be able to deal with. Do not be afraid to ask others to help when this happens.
- Always inspect the vehicle, winch, winch cable and winch controls for any signs of damage or parts in need of repair or replacement before each use. *Pay particular attention to the first three feet (one meter) of the winch cable if the winch is being used (or has been used) for lifting an accessory plow assembly.* Promptly replace any worn or damaged cable.
- 2. Never operate a winch or a vehicle in need of repair or service.
- Always apply your vehicle's parking brake and/or park mechanism to hold the vehicle in place during winching. Use wheel chocks if needed.
- 4. Always use the hook strap when handling the hook.




- Hook Strap
- A. Attach the hook itself onto the load or use a tow strap or chain to secure the load to the winch cable.

TIP: A "tow strap" is NOT intended to stretch. A "recovery strap" is designed to stretch.



NEVER use a recovery strap when winching due to the excessive energy that can be released if the winch cable breaks. This can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH. See the Shock Loading section on page 15.


ALWAYS replace the winch cable at the first sign of damage to prevent SEVERE INJURY or DEATH in the event of a failure. For your safety, always replace KOLPIN winch parts (including the cable) with KOLPIN replacement parts available at your authorized KOLPIN dealer or the KOLPIN website.

- E. Before operating the winch, be sure that the safety latch on the winch cable hook is fully seated when the load is attached.
- F. Never operate your winch with a damaged hook or latch. Always replace damaged parts before using the winch.
- 5. Never remove the hook strap from the hook.
- 6. Release the winch clutch and pull out the winch cable.
- 7. Pulling out as much cable as possible maximizes the winch's pulling capacity.

Always be sure that at least five full turns of winch cable are wrapped around the winch drum at all times. The friction provided by this wrapped cable allows the drum to pull on the winch cable and move the load.

- 8. Read and adhere to the following information for winch damping to ensure safe winch use.
 - A. In order to absorb energy that could be released by a winch cable failure, always place a "damper" on the winch cable. A damper can be a heavy jacket, tarp, or other soft, dense object. A damper can absorb much of the energy released if a winch cable breaks when winching. Even a tree limb can help as a damper if no other items are available to you.
 - B. Lay the damper on top of the mid-point of the winch cable length that is spooled out.
 - C. On a long pull, it may be necessary to stop winching so that the damper can be repositioned to the new mid-point of the winch cable. Always release the tension on the winch cable before repositioning the damper.
 - D. Avoid being directly in line with the winch cable whenever possible. Also, never permit others to stand near or in line with the winch cable during winch operation.
- 9. Never hook the winch cable back onto itself. This will damage the winch cable and may result in winch cable failure.
- 10. Never use straps, chains or other rigging items that are damaged or worn.
- 11. The ONLY time a winch-equipped vehicle should be moving when using the winch is when the vehicle itself is stuck. The winch equipped vehicle should NEVER be in motion to "shock" load the winch cable in an attempt to move a second stuck vehicle. See the *Shock Loading* section on page 14. For your safety, always follow these guidelines when winching a vehicle free:
 - A. Release the winch clutch and spool out the necessary length of winch cable.
 - B. Align the winch cable as close as possible to the winching vehicle's center line.
 - C. Attach the winch cable hook to the anchor point or the stuck vehicle's frame following instructions in this manual.
 - D. Re-engage the clutch on the winch.
 - E. Slowly winch in the slack in the winch cable.
 - F. Select the proper vehicle gear to propel the stuck vehicle in the direction of winching.
 - G. Shift to the lowest gear available on the stuck vehicle.
 - H. Slowly and carefully apply vehicle throttle and winch together to free the vehicle.
 - I. Stop winching as soon as the stuck vehicle is able to propel itself without the help of the winch.
 - J. Detach the winch cable hook.
 - K. Rewind the winch cable evenly back onto the winch drum following the instructions in this manual.

- 12. Never attempt to winch another stuck vehicle by attaching the winch cable to a suspension component, brush guard, bumper or cargo rack. Vehicle damage may result. Instead, attach the winch to a strong portion of the vehicle frame or hitch.
- 13. Extensive winching will run down the battery on the winching vehicle. Let the winching vehicle's engine run while operating the winch to prevent the battery from running low if winching for long periods.
- 14. The winch motor may become hot during winch use. If you winch for more than 45 seconds, or if the winch stalls during operation, stop winching and permit the winch to cool down for 10 minutes before using it again.
- 15. After winching is complete, especially if winching at an angle, it may be necessary to re-distribute the winch cable across the winch drum. You will need an assistant to perform this task.
 - A. Release the clutch on the winch.
 - B. Feed out the winch cable that is unevenly bunched up in one area.
 - C. Re-engage the winch clutch.
 - D. Have an assistant pull the winch cable tightly with about 100 lbs. (45 kg) of tension using the hook strap.
 - E. Slowly winch the cable in while your assistant moves the end of the winch cable back and forth horizontally to evenly distribute the winch cable on the drum.
 - F. Doing this reduces the chances of the winch cable "wedging" itself between lower layers of winch cable.


WINCH CABLE CARE

For your safety, always replace KOLPIN winch parts (including the cable) with KOLPIN replacement parts available at your authorized KOLPIN dealer or the KOLPIN website (Kolpin.com).

WARNING

NEVER use a worn or damaged cable. Use of a worn or damaged cable could lead to sudden failure and SEVERE INJURY.

- 1. Always inspect your winch before each use. Inspect for worn or loose parts including mounting hardware. Never use the winch if any part needs repair or replacement.
- 2. Always inspect your winch cable before each use. Inspect for worn or kinked winch cable.
 - A. A kinked winch cable made of wire rope is shown at right. Even after being "straightened out," this cable has already been permanently and severely damaged. Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.
 - B. A kinked winch cable made of wire rope that has been "straightened out" is shown at right. Even though it may look usable, the cable has been permanently and severely damaged. It can no longer transmit the load that it could prior to kinking. Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.
 - C. A winch cable made of synthetic rope should be inspected for signs of fraying. Replace the cable if fraying is observed (shown at right). Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.
 - D. Also replace the winch cable if there are fused or melted fibers. Such an area of the synthetic rope will be stiff and appear smooth or glazed. Promptly discontinue use of a winch cable in this condition.





SHOCK LOADING

NEVER shock load a winch cable. Your winch cable is very strong but it is NOT designed for dynamic, or "shock" loading. Shock loading may tension a winch cable beyond its strength and cause the cable to break. The end of a broken winch cable under such high loading can cause SEVERE INJURY or DEATH to you and other bystanders.

Winch cables are designed to NOT absorb energy. This is true of both wire-rope and synthetic-rope winch cables.

1. Never attempt to "jerk" a load with the winch. For example, never take up slack in the winch cable by moving the winching vehicle in an attempt to move an object. This is a dangerous practice. It generates high winch cable loads that may exceed the strength of the cable. Even a slowly moving vehicle can create large shock loads in a winch cable.



NEVER use a broken winch cable. SEVERE INJURY or DEATH can result.

- 2. Never quickly turn the winch ON and OFF repeatedly ("jogging"). This puts extra load on the winch, winch cable, and generates excessive heat from the motor. This is a form of shock loading.
- 3. Never tow a vehicle or other object with your winch. Towing an object with a winch produces shock loading of the cable even when towing at slow speeds. Towing from a winch also positions the towing force high on the vehicle. This can cause instability of the vehicle and possibly lead to an accident.
- 4. Never use recovery straps with your winch. Recovery straps are designed to stretch and can store energy. This stored energy in the recovery strap is released if a winch cable fails making the event even more hazardous. Similarly, never use elastic "bungie" cords for winching.
- 5. Never use the winch to tie down a vehicle to a trailer or other transportation vehicle. This type of use also causes shock loading that can cause damage to the winch, winch cable, or vehicles used.
- 6. Your winch cable is designed and tested to withstand the loads produced by the winch motor when operated from a stationary vehicle. Always remember that the winch and winch cable are NOT designed for shock loading.

WINCH MAINTENANCE AND SERVICE SAFETY

ALWAYS follow all winch instructions and warnings in this manual. Improper or lack of winch maintenance and service could lead to SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.

- 1. Always inspect your winch before each use. Inspect for worn or kinked winch cable. Also inspect for worn or loose parts including mounting hardware.
- 2. Permit your winch motor to cool down prior to servicing your winch.
- 3. Never work on your winch without first disconnecting the battery connections to prevent accidental activation of the winch
- 4. For your safety, always replace KOLPIN winch parts (including the cable) with KOLPIN replacement parts available at your authorized KOLPIN dealer or the KOLPIN website (Kolpin.com).
- 5. Some winch models use wire rope as the winch cable. Other winches use a specially designed synthetic rope as the winch cable.
- Never replace a synthetic-rope winch cable with a consumer-grade polymer rope such as can be purchased in a hardware store. Although they may look similar, they are NOT alike. A polymer rope not designed for winch use will stretch and store excessive energy when winching.

WARNING

ALWAYS be aware that failure of a stretched rope under winching conditions will release all of the stored energy. This will increase the chances of SEVERE INJURY or DEATH.

LUBRICATION

All moving parts within the electric winch have been lubricated using high temperature grease at the factory. No internal lubrication is required. Never grease or oil the winch cable. This will cause the winch cable to collect debris that will shorten the life of the cable.

CABLE ASSEMBLY REPLACEMENT

It is recommended that only KOLPIN supplied parts be used.

- 1. Move the clutch to the "free-spool" position.
- 2. Extend cable assembly to its full length. Note how the existing cable is connected to the inside of the drum.
- 3. Remove old cable assembly and attach new one.
- 4. Retract cable assembly onto drum being careful not to allow kinking.

- Read this manual and your ATV / UTV operators manual before use.
- Periodically check for wear and tightness of all fasteners. Replace or re-torque fasteners as necessary.
- Before first use, set plow in the furthest right or left angled position to check for interference with the vehicle.
- Operate with extreme caution on slopes and rough terrain. Be familiar with the area before you plow.
- · Be aware of immovable objects that could be hidden in the area you are plowing.
- To avoid damage when pushing snow into a pile, reverse direction before raising the plow blade.
- Do not ram the plow blade into piles of snow.
- For best results, set the suspension preload of your ATV / UTV to the stiffest setting.
- To reduce steering effort and increase mobility, set the air pressure of your tires to the maximum pressure specification.
- The plow skids are adjustable. General skid setting is even with the plow wear bar bottom edge, higher settings reduce the chance of rocks and gravel from being collected.
- To increase traction during plow operation, operators can try: Securing weight to the ATV / UTV for additional tire downforce, reducing tire air pressure, or installing tire chains.

TO AVOID SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH:






GENERAL


- 1. Park vehicle on a flat surface.
- 2. Shift vehicle into park.
- 3. Turn key to OFF position and remove key.
- 4. Remove the lower bumper screws on each side, two total. (See illustration 1-1). *Note, OEM screws will not be re-used with plow mounting plate. Save for install when plow mount is removed during off-season.*



ACCESSORY INSTALLATION

- Position mounting bracket (item #1) on vehicle front bumper and loosely install mount using the two M10 screws (item #4) with lock washers (item #6) and flat washers (item #5). (See illustration 1-2). *Note, do not tighten hardware at this time.*
- The mount bracket will be used as a template to mark the upper holes for drilling. Remove the mount bracket and drill the holes using 1/2" drill bit. (See illustration 1-3). *Note, the drilled holes will have exposed metal, touch-up the exposed edges using black spray paint.*






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

7. Install the mount bracket (item #1) using the M10 hardware (items #4, #5, #6) through the mounting plate side tabs into the vehicle bumper. Install the two upper M12 screws (item #2) with two M12 locknuts (item #3) through the drilled holes into the vehicle bumper. (See illustrations 1-4 and 1-5).



8. Tighten all hardware to specification.
